JCH Successful Preservation Projects

Thank you to our generous donors

With our mission to "collect, preserve, and share the history of the Jonathan Clark House and the early settlers of Mequon Thiensville" we developed a comprehensive preservation plan. In 2024 we started with our HVAC project and received funding from the Armond Koch Trust and from Cindy and Dave Bock

Also in 2024 the foundation was skillfully remortored and we are planning to re-grade around the foundation. The Pieper Power Foundation funded a portion of the expense and we are awaiting further funding from another local granting agency for the remaining expense of \$5,500.

Our most recent projects have helped to further preserve the house for generations to come.

- Cornice and gutter repair and replacement an anonymous group funded the majority of the expense with just \$1,000 remaining
- Exterior painting This is a \$6,000 project for which we are seeking funding
- Window repair and replacement We thank the Mequon Thiensville Community Foundation as well as Kim and Ann Harter for funding this important project.
- East and front entrances repair and replacement of sections we are seeking a \$3,000 grant for this project.


